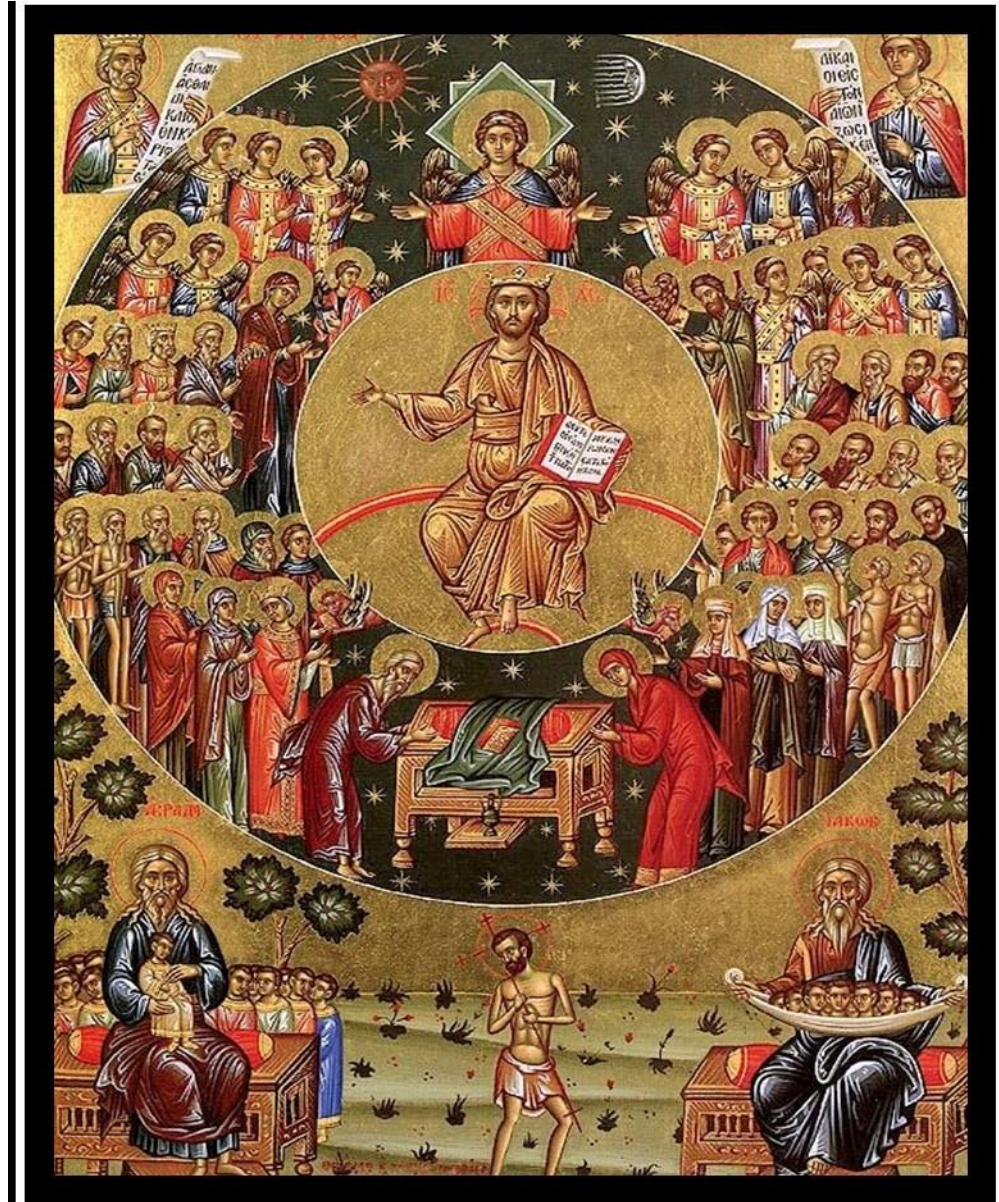

A Reading from the Prophet Isaiah Isaiah 25: 6-9

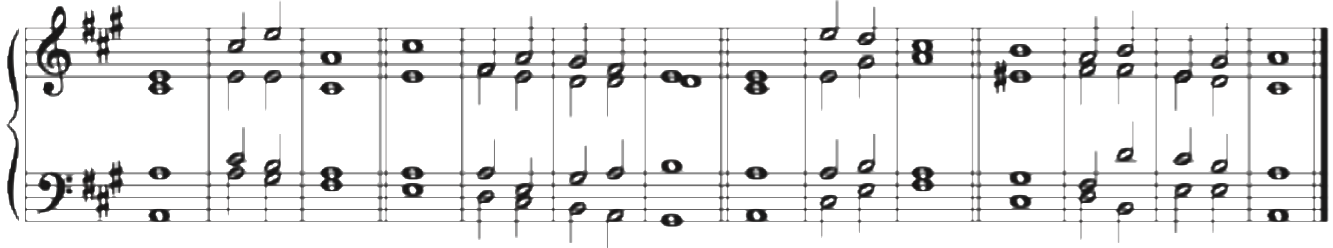
On this mountain the Lord of hosts will make for all peoples a feast of rich food, a feast of well-aged





- Celebrant* Will you by your prayers and witness help this child to grow into the full stature of Christ?
- Parents* **We will, with God's help.**
- Celebrant* Do you renounce Satan and all the spiritual forces of wickedness that rebel against God?
- Answer* **I renounce them.**

People **I will, with God's help.**

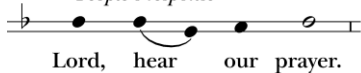

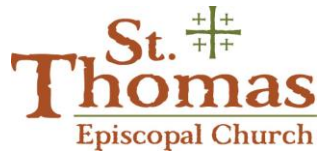
